

MESSAGE FROM LEADERSHIP



Dear Friends,

At the Community Foundation of the Florida Keys, connection is at the heart of everything we do. In a place as geographically unique and community-minded as the Keys, we see our role clearly: to connect people who care with causes that matter, from Key Largo to Key West and every island in between.

In our 2021-2025 strategic plan, we set ambitious goals—to grow our assets, broaden our reach, and strengthen the nonprofits that serve our island communities. Four years later, we are proud to report transformational progress.

Since 2021, our assets under management have grown from \$21 million to **more than \$33 million**. This asset growth has enabled the Foundation and our fundholders to increase the size and impact of our collective grant-making.

In 2024, the Foundation awarded **\$2,142,550 in grants to local nonprofits**, \$303,843 more than the previous year. We also awarded a record number of grants through our annual grants process, distributing a total of \$739,888 from Foundation and donor-advised funds. These grants supported important community needs from youth programs and scholarships to health services, food access, affordable housing, the arts and the environment. We are deeply grateful to our fundholders, donors, and partners who make this impact possible.

Our nonprofit endowment funds increased to **36 funds** this year, representing more than **\$3.8 million** in invested assets. Congratulations to these local organizations for proactively planning for their long-term financial health.

As we look back on the past year, we are especially proud of how the foundation is becoming more visible and accessible across the entire island chain. Through grant-making, community events, nonprofit trainings, and local partnerships, we are **building connections** that strengthen the social fabric of the Keys, today and for the future.

We would like to extend a special thank you to our immediate past leaders who were so instrumental in our success today—former Board Chair, Will Langley, and immediate past President and CEO, Jennifer McComb.

In 2025 we will remain focused on what matters most: increasing opportunity and resilience across the entirety of the Keys. We'll continue investing in strong nonprofits, expanding local philanthropy, and deepening the connections that make our community foundation uniquely suited to serve the Florida Keys.



REGIONAL IMPACT

The Community Foundation's three regional Future Funds raise money that stays hyper-local and supports nonprofit grants in each region. Regional Advisory Councils in the Upper, Middle, and Lower Keys guide these grant-making efforts. Regional advisors help raise awareness of the Community Foundation, identify local needs to inform funding decisions, and collaborate with nonprofit grantees.



LOWER KEYS ADVISORY COUNCIL

The Lower Keys Advisory Council granted a total of \$29,000 to nonprofits between Big Coppitt and Big Pine Key in 2024. Sugarloaf School PTO was awarded \$6,000 towards the purchase of their book vending machine, and Seacamp was awarded a grant to purchase water quality testing equipment. Other grantees included the Big Pine Athletic Association, Florida Keys Wildlife Society, Key Deer Protection Alliance, and the Lower Keys Rotary for rods for their annual Kids Fishing Tournament.



MIDDLE KEYS ADVISORY COUNCIL

The Middle Keys Advisory Council distributed a total of \$8,000 in grants and scholarships in the Marathon area in 2024. Keys Area Interdenominational Resources received a grant for supplies for their food pantry, which provides quality food items to households experiencing food insecurity. Independence Cay received a grant for hygiene equipment and other supplies for their shower, laundry and housing facilities. Additionally, two scholarships were awarded to graduating seniors Jayda Lugo and Emma Momaly.



UPPER KEYS ADVISORY COUNCIL

The Upper Keys Advisory Council distributed a total of \$8,600 in grants and scholarships in the Upper Keys in 2024. Key Largo School received a grant to help fund their Spanish Infusion Project, which teaches children in grades K-5 about Latin cultures. The Key Players received a grant for their community theater program and DOLPHINS To Stop Domestic Violence received funds for materials for their ESE Students. Scholarships were also awarded to graduating seniors Victoria Pena and Olivia Hughes.

COMMUNITY GRANT PROGRAM

In the 2024 Action for Impact annual competitive grants program, community members serving on our grants committee reviewed and scored applications submitted by Florida Keys nonprofits, ultimately selecting the top 51 applicants for funding. A total of \$739,888 was awarded through this program to 51 nonprofit organizations serving our Keys communities.

2024 NONPROFIT GRANTEE SPOTLIGHT: WOMANKIND

Womankind's initiative to **expand their women's healthcare services into the Middle Keys** received the largest funding appropriation this year. In 2024, Womankind opened their Marathon office with a limited schedule to start. Demand grew quickly, and they expanded their hours to meet it. In their first year in Marathon, Womankind treated 305 women across 528 visits.

Womankind is filling a critical healthcare gap in the Middle Keys. Before this grant, advanced gynecological care was not available on-site in the Middle Keys. Now, their board-certified gynecologist, Dr. Ann Mitzner, visits Marathon twice a month, offering elevated care and complex case management. And Marathon residents are ecstatic to have local care.

A major advancement made possible through this grant was the purchase of a colposcope, allowing patients to receive critical diagnostic testing locally. One Marathon patient who delayed care due to transportation barriers was diagnosed with endometrial cancer through this new service. **Without Womankind's presence and the diagnostic tools funded by the grant, her cancer likely would have gone undiagnosed even longer.**

“ Everyone was kind, welcoming, gentle and genuine. I felt at ease, safe, comfortable, and never ashamed or embarrassed. The nurses and doctor took time to ask questions and listen to my responses I'm so thankful we have a Womankind in Marathon now! ”

Perhaps the most visible and heartening impact has been in prenatal care—a service essentially unavailable in the Middle Keys before Womankind's expansion. They have now **provided prenatal care to 44 pregnant women during 204 visits.**

This grant helped Womankind bring essential women's healthcare, including prenatal services, to a part of the Keys where options were nearly nonexistent. It has helped Womankind save lives, support healthy pregnancies, and meet women where they are with compassion and respect, creating a foundation for ongoing growth and sustainability.

2024 UN Sung HERO SPOTLIGHT: JOY BROWN TAYLOR



Joy, you do so much with so many organizations in the Keys. What first inspired you to volunteer?

I have spent time learning, giving and growing through volunteer commitments to various organizations over the years, each of which inspired me with its unique 'message.' In the case of One Island Family, we espouse universal democratic Principles. This is a continuing journey of affirmation of our values and sharing through our actions. Volunteering has also led to wonderful, lifelong friendships with other Unitarian Universalists, and so many others!

Can you describe a moment in volunteering that made you feel especially connected or proud?

As we ended the affirming experience of parading with and for PRIDE on June 29th, I was feeling comforted for the first time in ages. We of One Island Family were actively honoring "The inherent worth and dignity of every person," one of the basic Principles that attracted me to Unitarian Universalism. Further, the participants were all united in "The goal of world community with peace, liberty, and justice for all." Does it get any better than that?

I am reminded that we are allowed to be happy; we are allowed to celebrate our differences as the strengths that add to our community; we are PROUD to live in the kinder, gentler, more caring community of Key West.

What would you say to others thinking about getting involved?

CONNECTION is the key word. A few months ago one of my volunteer groups was being taped as we arrived on Saturday morning and asked the question, "Why do you participate in this?" The standard response was of course "our mission," the good we are able to do in our community. I must add this: the fun and fellowship of our group puts a big smile on my face.

Thank you to Lower Keys Medical Center and Keys Weekly for their continued support for the Unsung Heroes celebration and the volunteers honored.




LEADERSHIP SUCCESS ACADEMY

Since 2008, the Leadership Success Academy has trained nearly 700 leaders Keys-wide who are committed to providing exemplary leadership for organizations they care about.

2024 LEADERSHIP SUCCESS ACADEMY SPOTLIGHT: KATE BANICK



Kate, you are both a graduate of the program and, most recently, a presenter. What first inspired you to participate in the Leadership Success Academy?

I've worked in the nonprofit sector for over 20 years, and one thing is clear—it's a constantly evolving field. For nonprofit leaders, staying adaptable and continuing to learn is essential. When I saw the opportunity to learn from, connect with, and then help educate other passionate individuals through such a well-organized and focused program, I knew it was something worth pursuing. It absolutely lived up to my expectations, both as a participant and presenter!

How has the Good Health Clinic benefited from your participation in the program?

As an Executive Director, I completed the LSA program, and six of our board members have also taken part over the years. The classes have enhanced the way our board functions as a team. What would you say to a future participant considering applying for LSA?



2024 SCHOLAR SPOTLIGHT: PARKER CURRY



What does receiving the Floy V. Thompson Community Awareness Scholarship mean to you, Parker?

For me, receiving the Floy V. Thompson Community Awareness Scholarship enabled me to attend Vanderbilt University without the financial stress. I have been able to focus on excelling in my classes, exploring new academic interests, and taking part in the unbelievable experience of marching band in the Southeastern Conference. We are all very grateful for the support this scholarship has provided.

How has the support from this scholarship changed your path or helped you pursue your goals?

The Floy V. Thompson Community Awareness Scholarship helped me pursue my love of physics and mathematics at a Top 20 university where I am surrounded by an incredible student body and even more amazing physics professors. Last semester, my physics course had eight other students and was taught by a long-time Vanderbilt professor. In the near future at Vandy, this scholarship will allow me to pursue research opportunities.

Can you tell us about what you're studying and what you hope to do in the future?

I am an intended physics major and am considering a double major in applied math. I also plan to do the astronomy minor that Vanderbilt offers. After my time in undergrad I plan on going to grad school to pursue a PhD in physics, but I'm not sure what specific field I want to go into just yet. Beyond that, I would really like to work in a government research lab or in industry at a start-up.

Karen, you joined the Community Foundation's Legacy Society this year with a bequest for the Friends of the Key Largo Library. What inspired you to include this in your estate plans?

Memories of libraries and the impact they had on my life from early to elder inspired me to give my energy now to support programming, and to consider how I can support our library after I'm gone.

When I think about estate planning, trust, intention and impact matter to me. I want to know my wishes will be carried out in, what I hope to be, a good number of years from now. I trust the Community Foundation of the Florida Keys to be there, still strong, in the community.

Was there a moment in your life or a personal value that shaped your decision to join the Legacy Society and give in this way?

I have had some very wealthy friends in my life that have taught me by example the value of planned giving and what can be accomplished when a community-based not for profit can feel secure in its funding.

What would you say to someone considering a legacy gift?

My financial advisor and I and CFFK had a conference call to discuss the best way to arrange for the planned giving donation. There were questions about logistics, and the professional way that conversation was handled was reassuring to my advisor and myself. I never felt pressure or expectations—what I felt was supported in a decision I had made. I feel good that I will be able to make a difference to my community, from toddlers to elders, long after I leave this life.

2024 BOARD SPOTLIGHT: WARREN LEAMARD

Warren, what drew you to serve on the Board of Governors for the Community Foundation?

My first introduction to the Foundation was through a friend, Veronica Webb. She had established a fund with the Foundation, and we worked together on some events to raise money for the fund.

What keeps me involved is how the Foundation magnifies community impact. For example, the Sunrise Rotary has a fund with the Foundation, and we've seen how much further our contributions have gone over the years just by investing with the Community Foundation. It's all about helping my community.

What do you think sets the Foundation apart from other organizations?

Trustworthiness. I love being a part of an organization that is so transparent and trustworthy. The Foundation has always maintained a great reputation, and I try to enhance that wherever I can.

Can you share a moment during your board service that felt especially meaningful?

There have been many, but one really resonated with me because of my career in catering and food service. Elizabeth Brown, the Foundation's president and CEO, was giving a presentation about the issues facing residents in the Keys and she used the term "food insecurity." I knew what it meant, but it caught me off guard. I looked up from the report I was reading and asked, "Do you mean that people are going hungry right here in Monroe County?" And she said, "Pretty much, yes."

I got a little angry, not at the Foundation, but at the fact that people are going hungry. That was a moment when I decided to try to bring more awareness to this issue through my service.

2024 NEW FUND SPOTLIGHT: *WESLEY HOUSE*



For nearly 100 years, Wesley House Family Services has been **a lifeline for children and families in the Florida Keys.** Whether supporting foster families, strengthening families at risk of separation, or providing affordable childcare and counseling, Wesley House is dedicated to keeping our island communities strong and connected.

In 2024, Wesley House deepened its **commitment to long-term sustainability** by opening two new funds at the Community Foundation of the Florida Keys: the Wesley House Children and Families Fund and the Wesley House Marion Stevens Endowment Fund.

The Wesley House Children and Families Fund is an Agency Fund which allows the organization to manage current resources for immediate needs and strategic priorities, ensuring flexibility to respond to emerging challenges.

The Wesley House Marion Stevens Endowment Fund, established in part by a grant from the Marion Stevens Fund, is a permanent fund designed to grow over time, **creating a lasting source of support** to sustain their programs for generations to come.

By establishing both an agency fund and an endowment fund, Wesley House is investing in the future of children and families across Monroe County, helping ensure that no matter what lies ahead, **critical services will remain strong and accessible.**

The Community Foundation is honored to partner with Wesley House Family Services in connecting people, resources, and care throughout the Keys.
