A Positive Step of Monroe County - *Idle Hands Summer Youth Program*

APSMC’s Idle Hands Summer Youth Program provides at-risk high school students in the Lower Keys with paid summer jobs that build real-world work experience and essential career skills. Through mentorship, skill development, and exposure to diverse professions, students gain confidence, explore career paths, and stay engaged in their education. By fostering personal growth and strengthening community ties, the program prepares youth for future success while reducing the risk of dropout and disengagement.

AH of Monroe County - *Food Matters: A Holistic Nutrition Program*

Food security and proper nutrition are vital to AH Monroe's mission of improving the health of Monroe County residents. The “Food Matters” initiative addresses this need through four core components:

- Access to free, nutritious foods for more than 260 households per month through our Key West food pantry
- Monthly \$75 grocery vouchers for 90 low- income residents with significant medical conditions
- Nutrition-related referrals and case management support available for all 581 AH clients and tenants
- Series of hands-on nutrition education classes in partnership with SOS, available to all AH Monroe clients

This holistic approach empowers individuals and families to improve their health, reduce financial strain, and gain the tools needed for lifelong well-being. By meeting immediate food insecurity needs and setting the stage for long-term success, “Food Matters” helps stabilize lives and strengthens the overall health of our community.

This grant request seeks \$11,125.25 to address two critical needs: approximately \$3,600 for professional repairs to cracks in the building foundation, ensuring the safety and longevity of the facility, and \$7,525.25 to fund concession counter employee wages, which support daily operations and maintain a welcoming environment for members. The funds will help Anchors Aweigh Club continue its unique role in the community, providing a trusted venue for recovery, facilitating referrals from judicial and community partners, and offering resources and support to vulnerable populations, including those facing homelessness, veterans, individuals with co-occurring disorders, and families supporting loved ones in recovery. All attendees remain anonymous, and all individuals seeking support are welcomed.

The proposed Telemedicine Virtual Patient Navigation Program offers a comprehensive approach to addressing healthcare disparities in rural communities, more specifically in the Florida Keys. By leveraging technology and personalized support, the program aims to enhance access to care & improve health outcomes for Baptist Health Cancer Care patients in the Florida Keys.

Burton Memorial United Methodist Church - *Food Pantry Groceries and Meals*

Our food pantry is unique in that it is open 2 days a week with a varied schedule to accommodate working adults and parents with children, and we are centrally located in the Upper Keys. Other food pantries are open 1 day a week and are at opposite ends of the Upper Keys. Our hours are Wednesday 9am-12pm and Thursday 5 pm-7 pm. Our free community meal is on Thursdays. These varied hours allow families to access fresh produce and bread weekly, along with groceries once a month, based on family size. Other churches have meal offerings, scheduled so as to not duplicate services, thus providing more opportunity throughout the week to have a prepared meal. Our 2026 goal is to solicit, collect, organize, and distribute at least 200,000 pounds of groceries. and serve at least 4,500 meals.

Coral Restoration Foundation - *Coral Reefs and You: Transforming Education into Ecosystem Impact*

Local socioeconomic conditions depend on the reef, yet many working residents of Monroe County—designated as under-served under Executive Order 13985—are excluded from the benefits of their local reefs. Coral Reefs & You is a multi-year education initiative from CRF to engage every 5th, 8th, & 12th-grade student (6,000+) in Monroe County with state-aligned lessons & reef field experiences that explore the social, economic, & ecological importance of Florida’s reefs. Designed by CRF staff & taught with trained college interns, the program fosters environmental stewardship across generations. Launched in 2024, it reached 1,434 students in its first year, delivering 250+ hours of classroom instruction & engaging 444 students & chaperons in snorkeling trips. Moving into the second year of the project, all materials have been translated into Spanish & Haitian Creole to provide equitable access. This initiative received county-wide support & a formal endorsement from the Superintendent.

Dance Key West believes physical movement is imperative to good health and that every creative voice deserves to be nurtured.

The initiative seeks to collaborate with local educators, schools, artists, and musicians to curate innovative programming that blend science and storytelling, bringing marine mammal conservation to life for residents

Together, these camps will introduce students to career pathways in hospitality, eco-tourism, and marine industries, equipping them with the skills and confidence to pursue meaningful employment in the Florida Keys.

In addition to these local workshops, we will provide five scholarships that cover admission, travel, lodging, and a stipend for educators to attend FCEE’s statewide Financial Literacy Summit, where they will return with enhanced skills, new resources, and actionable strategies to strengthen financial education in their classrooms.

Currently, Safe Haven protects the pets of domestic violence survivors. With this grant, we will also shelter the pets of residents experiencing sudden medical emergencies who must be transported to the mainland for treatment. At an average cost of \$80 per day per pet and an average stay of 2–4 weeks, this funding will provide compassionate care for 12–15 pets annually; ensuring families can focus on healing and safety without the fear of losing their beloved animals. By protecting both people and pets during their most vulnerable times, Safe Haven strengthens community resilience and makes the Florida Keys a better, more compassionate place to live.

IDC provides individual family programs as well as group therapy programs to local, nonprofit organizations. We believe these kids are worth it and many times, these costs come out of the coach's personal funds when donations aren't available.
